

ST. PETER AND ST. PAUL APOSTLES JUNE 29, 2008

Through all the earth their voice resounds, and to the ends of the world, their message. —*Psalm 19:5*



My Sisters and Brothers:

Today we celebrate this Feast Day of Saints Peter and Paul. Both of these men worked tirelessly and fearlessly to promote the message of Jesus as the Risen Messiah. The early apostles were men in the full sense of masculine desire for achievement regardless of the suffering needed to complete the task. Even after many trials and sufferings, Paul writes to Timothy in the second reading today, "The Lord stood by me and gave me strength, so that through me the proclamation might be completed . . . The Lord will rescue me from every evil threat and will bring me safe to his heavenly home."

During this novena of Masses for Fathers' Day, we continue to reflect upon our earthly fathers as role models for their children so they can better understand our heavenly Father, God. Understanding God truly as "Father" helps us to understand why He treats us the way He often does. Why do earthly fathers allow their children to experience hardship? They allow their children to experience some pain that they will learn to deal with it, to grow emotionally, and to cultivate virtue. Fathers are also available to give their children the instructions and discipline they need to make them strong.

If we expect the Church, founded by Christ upon the apostles, to continue serving the mission of the Gospel, we need more men to model God's fatherly presence to our children. Our children need to see their fathers taking a spiritual leadership role in the family as well as in the Church. President John F. Kennedy said during his inaugural speech, "Ask not what your country can do for you—ask what you can do for your country." As Catholics we should be hearing, "Don't ask what the Church can do for you (Baptism, Confession, Communion, Confirmation, Marriage & Anointing of the Sick, Quinceanera)—ask what you can do for your Church.

It is a blessing to have many women involved in so many ministries of the parish, but our children need to experience more men in serving as catechist, youth minister, etc. I am thankful for all the many men and women who are already actively practicing their Catholic Faith through various ministries and parish organizations. As the spiritual father of this community, I am asking all men to join me in imitating the apostles Peter and Paul and to work as ministers of the Gospel by becoming more active in the various ministries within our parish. I also want to encourage all men to attend the Men's retreat with Cardinal DiNardo on July 19, 2008 entitled, "Becoming the Man God meant you to be". The apostles Peter and Paul gave all their time, energy and even shed their blood to promote the Catholic Faith. How much of your life have you given to promote our Faith within your home and within our parish?

PETER AND PAUL: Today is something of a rarity: the celebration of a saint's day that replaces the Sunday liturgy. Only a handful of these days, given the official rank of "solemnity," are considered so foundational and primal to the mission of the Church that they can interrupt the Sunday sequence. And so it is with Peter and Paul today.

In a way, they each have personality traits with which we can identify. They are both impetuous, sometimes acting or speaking thoughtlessly, contradicting the spiritual gifts given to them by God. At such times, they might receive a nudge from God, much the same as many of us experience. On the positive side, these men were deeply rooted in their faith in Christ, tireless and fearless in living out their call to spread the Good News of his death and resurrection. Perhaps we might identify more with one or the other, but the essential truth we celebrate today is this: Through the Spirit, Christ built and continues to build the Church and make the kingdom known through fragile, remarkable human beings, each graced in a particular way for the work of the reign of God. © Copyright, J. Mis Queridos Hermanos y Hermanas:

Hoy celebramos el día de Fiesta de los Santos Pedro y Pablo. Ambos de estos hombres trabajaron incansablemente y sin miedo para promover el mensaje de Jesús como el Mesías Resucitado.
